We have **One Mission**: to inspire the next generation of first responders. Focus is on administrative assignments, online research, appointment setup and community outreach. Intern will serve as a THF point of contact, content editor and organizational development strategist for our key programs/initiatives that take place throughout the fiscal year.

The responsibilities of this position require a swift and comprehensive grasp our mission, purpose and vision. For example, the intern will support our Youth Preparedness & Wetland Resilience Clubs, which has impacted more than 4,000 students in 40 schools across 15 U.S. cities. These programs focus on educating/empowering vulnerable New Orleans children and families about the importance of being prepared for emergencies through environmentally sustainable techniques.

OVERVIEW

The THF Internship Program is geared toward students/young professionals. Ideal applicants are those who have a demonstrated passion for community service or would like to continue to make a positive social impact on the city of New Orleans and Gulf Coast region; those who seek unique opportunities to obtain professional portfolio/resume experience and or college course credit for service-learning classes.

We seek to partner with those who are industrious, creative and have dependable flexibility during the workweek. Upon completion, interns are asked to complete a Self Evaluation; each intern also receives a Supervisory Performance Evaluation, Future Reference Contact Form and Certified Letter of Completion.
